## Objective

The governments of Egypt, Lebanon and Morocco have prioritized the development of renewable energy resources, especially wind and solar power. As a follow-up deliverable to the MENA Power 2010: A Middle East & North Africa Technology and Projects Forum, the U.S. Trade and Development Agency is sponsoring a two-week Reverse Trade Mission to the United States focusing on renewable energy technologies. The delegation will consist of representatives from the private and public sectors of Egypt, Lebanon and Morocco.

The Renewable Energy Reverse Trade Mission is designed to showcase U.S. renewable energy technology and solutions through a series of meetings and site visits with U.S. solar and wind manufacturers and developers.

The Reverse Trade Mission will provide U.S. companies with an opportunity to:

- Showcase their renewable energy technologies, including generation and manufacturing facilities, through site visits;
- Network with delegates at the Solar Power International 2010 Conference in Los Angeles;
- Attend a Business Briefing in San Francisco, highlighting wind and solar project opportunities in Egypt, Lebanon and Morocco; and
- Conduct one-on-one meetings with Reverse Trade Mission participants to discuss renewable energy business opportunities.
